40 Days for Life Fall Campaigns - St. Paul and Moorhead



Shawn Carney, President and CEO of 40 Days for Life National, spoke to about 100 attendees at the September 25 Opening Vigil for our Twin Cities Fall Campaign outside the St. Paul Planned Parenthood (PP). He chose this location to attend on the first day because this is the abortion mill “toured” by Vice Pres. Kamala Harris and Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz last March as they promoted abor-

tion.

“Despite nearly 50 years of strong rhetoric supporting abortion, no vice president or president has ever visited an abortion facility until Kamala Harris visited the Planned Parenthood in St. Paul, Minn.” Shawn said. “Until recently, (abortion) has never been propped up as a cause for inspiration to a better future in America.” Twenty-one churches “adopt-

ed” a total of 15 days during this campaign.

In Moorhead, Minn. (right above), about 50 people attended our kick-off vigil for the 40 Days for Life Campaign outside the Red River Women’s Clinic. Prior to that, on September 14, about 50 pro-lifers participated in the LIFE

God's Grace Kept Me Calm When I Was Punched

Before I tell the story, I want to make it very clear I am fine and it is just as safe to be on the sidewalk praying or sidewalk counseling today as it was before this assault took place. My purpose in retelling this story will be clear as you read it.

I took a shift sidewalk counseling at the mega-Planned Parenthood (PP) in St. Paul, Minn. on Wednesday, October 16. The Whole Woman's abortion facility in Bloomington was closed that morning where I regularly sidewalk counsel on Wednesdays. I was asked to fill in at PP for someone who could not make their regular time so that the other sidewalk counselor would have a partner. Since this is the location of our 40 Days for Life campaign, a good-sized group from a church were on the sidewalk praying.

I jumped right back into effort as if this was still my regular place to sidewalk counsel, offering literature, calling out to clients with words of help and hope, and letting the PP escort know that she is loved by God and can be set free by turning to Jesus.

About a half hour into my time there, a young couple came walking out of PP toward us. The clinic escort intercepted them before they were halfway down that long driveway and redirected them to cut across the property adjacent to PP. That private property houses a nonprofit business very sympathetic to PP. In other words, I had to stay on the public sidewalk somewhere 40-50 feet away from the couple crossing that parking lot.

At this point I did not know whether they were leaving having had aborted or were going out and would be coming back to abort their precious child. I called out letting them know that there was help available. They stopped in the middle of the parking lot and the young man called out back to me. Because of the loud trucks that roll through this industrial park neighborhood, I could not hear what he was saying – at first.

Then I did hear him say something to the effect that he would hit me if I kept talking to him. I assumed I only had one or two more chances to tell them about

the free help so I gave them verbal directions to the nearby pregnancy resource center. It was then that he started to walk toward me over the objections of his girlfriend. He walked right in front of me and told me that if I didn't stop talking to him he would hit me. I told him that all I was trying to say was that we have free help for them. Since that was still talking to him, he repeated his threat and I repeated that I was just offering them free help. Once more he stated he would hit me if I kept talking to him so I turned slightly toward the young woman and told her of the help. That's when he punched me in the face.

The punch wasn't all that hard and barely caused me to turn my head away for a moment. He looked at me for a moment and then quickly turned away, walking back into the parking lot of the private property. Unfortunately, he hit the bottom of my sunglasses and the rim cut into my upper cheek causing it to bleed rather profusely which I didn't know at first. Had it not been for my sunglasses, I probably wouldn't even have received a bruise. By God's grace, I

remained perfectly calm and let him go without taking any retaliatory moves. I called out to others to call the police, which they did. I pulled out my cell phone to capture images of him for the police. When I went back to the area where all the prayer supporters were, I was offered a paper towel to clean up the blood, assured everyone I was fine and asked for prayers for the young couple, especially for the safety of the woman.

For clarity's sake, I never even mentioned the word abortion, only letting them know of free help. Obviously, I would not have been hit if I had simply quit telling them of that help. But true help was needed for the woman having just aborted and for the man with his, just as obvious, anger issues.

The police say they are investigating. I truly hope they are. Though I hold no animosity toward the young man, justice does demand that he be accountable for his bad actions and the prevention of future bad actions.

All of this could also be chalked up to our prayer stirring up demonic activity. That's always a reality when we pray and evangelize where babies are being sacrificed to the evil of this present age. But that can be viewed as a compliment to those taking the time to pray and show their love of God and His precious little ones outside these places of darkness and grave harm.

Justice Served in Case of Sign Theft

Over the years, many of our signs have been grabbed by pro-abortion passersby as we are sidewalk counseling outside abortion facilities. But sometimes these individuals are held accountable.

In the February issue of this newsletter we reported on the case of a sign stolen from one of our sidewalk counselors outside the Brooklyn Park, Minn. Planned Parenthood (PP). The man pled guilty and was ordered to pay restitution because he no longer had the sign. We received his payment through the courts.

Later, a sign was stolen from pro-life volunteers outside the abortion mill in Moorhead, Minn. Due to the fact that they recorded the license plate number of

happy to reimburse the congregants for their trouble."

We are grateful to have received these payments because these signs are not cheap and we appreciate the donors who support our ministry. But we also know that it's unlikely that these individuals, once contacted by the police, will steal our signs again, even if they are not yet repentant of their theft. In fact, in the letter accompanying the check, the officer wrote, "The person was advised to stay away from this location."

Thank you to our volunteers for their alertness on the sidewalk and their willingness to work with our staff to see that justice is done, all in the course of attempting to save the lives of unborn children.

Man Wakes Up as his Organs Were About to be Harvested

You may be aware of a Kentucky man waking up as they were about to harvest his organs for donation. It's good news that Anthony Thomas Hoover II (TJ) is alive, but the circumstances surrounding this event as reported by multiple news sources are horrifying.

Donna Rhorer, TJ's sister, was oblivious to what had happened to her brother and would never have known the truth if not for a whistleblower coming forward. At the time, Nyckoletta Martin was employed by Kentucky Organ Donor Affiliates (KODA) and was in the surgical suite that day. She later resigned because of TJ's case and testified before Congress in September 2024 about what she saw.

TJ suffered a cardiac arrest and was rushed to Kentucky's Baptist Health Richmond, a hospital 30 miles away. His brain suffered from oxygen deprivation. That same day doctors told Donna and other family members "there were no reflexes, no brain activity, no brain waves."

The following day the family agreed to remove TJ from life support.

Since TJ was a registered organ donor, the organ procurement team went into action, testing his organs for harvesting. The morning of the intended retrieval of TJ's organs, he had woken up during a catheterization of his heart, but the family was not informed.

During the hospital's "honor walk," the ceremonial moving of an organ donor to the surgical suite, Donna noticed TJ's eyes were opening and that he was tracking. But she was told by staff that it was only reflexes, a normal event. The family felt they were not qualified to doubt the medical team.

Nyckoletta Martin gave a firsthand account of what she witnessed in the surgical suite that day. TJ was "thrashing around on the table, trying to pull his tube out, and pushing their hands away, crying and shaking his head no. He knew what was going on." Natasha Miller who was there to preserve the organs said, "He was crying visibly."

About an hour into the process the doc-

tor came out and told the family TJ had woken up and that he refused to harvest his organs.

Nyckoletta then heard the KODA coordinator call out to the KODA admin, "You will find another doctor to carry out this case. If you don't you're going to get fired."

If this scenario was correct and the medical team had proceeded with a new surgeon, they would almost certainly have been complicit in committing murder by organ donation.

None of this information had been shared with the family until Nyckoletta came forward.

While testifying before Congress in September 2024, Dr. Seth Karp, Surgeon-in-Chief at Vanderbilt University said that it was "not infrequent" that questions came up about the life or death status of organ donors. "The problem is we've got 40 years where there has been no oversight at all of OPO's (organ procurement organizations)."

Organ donation involves significant amounts of money for the medical community. The hospital benefits from billing for harvesting the organs and there's a double benefit if it is able to also bill for transplanting them into waiting patients.

Evidence is mounting that the lucrative business of organ donation may be enticing medical staff and hospitals to cross the line in taking some lives while saving others.

If so, the subjective definition of determining "brain death" is giving them cover. At one time the American Academy of Neurology stated on their website, "Many of the details of the clinical neurologic examination to determine brain death **cannot be established by evidence-based methods**. The detailed brain death evaluation protocol that follows is intended as a useful tool for clinicians. **It must be emphasized that this guidance is opinion-based**. Alternative protocols may be equally informative." (emphasis added)

If you have second thoughts about being an organ donor, there are specific things you must do. Our website (www.lifeissues.org) provides links to the requirements of each individual state. (See

(Editor's note — In an October 17 story on this case, National Public Radio [NPR] reported, "Thaddeus Pope, a bioethicist and lawyer at the Mitchell Hamline School of Law in St. Paul who studies organ donation, cites similar accusations reported elsewhere. 'This is not a one-off,' Pope says. 'It has been alleged to happen before.' Dr. Robert Cannon, a transplant surgeon at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, described a similar incident during the congressional hearing where Martin's letter was disclosed. It happened at a hospital outside of Alabama. 'We actually were in the operating room. We had actually opened the patient and were in the process of sort of preparing their organs, at which point the ventilator triggered and so the anesthesiologist at the head of the table spoke up and said, 'Hey, I think this patient might have just breathed,' Cannon later told NPR in an interview. 'If the patient breathes, that means they're not brain dead.' Nevertheless, a representative from the OPO wanted to proceed anyway, Cannon says. He refused. 'We were kind of shocked that an OPO person would have so little knowledge about what brain death means that they would say, 'Oh, you should just go ahead.' And we thought, 'No. We're not going to take any risk that we murder a patient.' Because that's what it would be if that patient was alive.'")

Babies Saved

Marilee Hanson, 63, is the daughter of abortionist Mildred Hanson who took over her mother's abortion mill in south Minneapolis when the older Hanson died in 2015. (Mildred was very well-known in abortion circles, even having a late-term abortion procedure named after her — the "Hanson maneuver.")

In late 2018, Marilee closed this abortion center. We kept her name on this list to pray for because we had not heard that she quit the abortion business completely. Now we have recently learned that Marilee has worked for the CARE abortion mill in Bellevue, Neb., the abortion business previously owned and operated by the late LeRoy Carhart.

We've also learned that Marilee is still licensed in Minnesota (where she maintains her residence) and also in Colorado. She had a license in Maryland, but that expired in September. So, it appears that she did not actually retire in 2018.

Please pray that Marilee would NOT follow in her mother's footsteps, continuing to be involved in abortion to old age. Instead, pray that she would soon repent and turn her life over to Christ.

Is Your Doctor Involved in Abortions? Does Your Doctor Prescribe Abortifacient Birth Control?

Ask your doctor if he/she does abortions or refers for them, or prescribes abortifacients such as the Pill, Ortho Evra (the "patch"), Depo-Provera (the "shot"), Nuva-Ring, the "morning-after pill," implants, or the IUD. All these methods (and others) can cause very early abortions by thinning the lining of the uterus so that if breakthrough ovulation occurs (which is possible) and a new life is conceived, the young human being may not be able to attach to the uterine lining and therefore he or she dies. 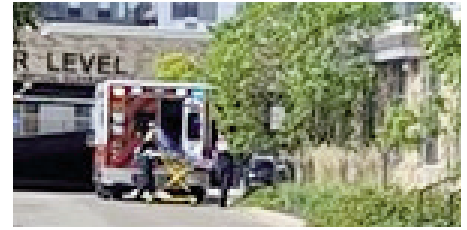

More Women Taken by Ambulance from Local Abortion Mills



When a woman goes to an abortion facility she doesn't expect to end up in the hospital, but it happens more often than the abortion industry and mainstream media want the public to know. It happened recently to at least two more abortion clients in the Twin Cities.

On August 14, around 2:45 p.m., an Allina Health ambulance was seen at the back door of Whole Woman's abortion facility in Bloomington. According to the 911 transcript, the Whole Woman's staffer explained, "Um, calling from Whole Women's Health, um, we have a, um, 29-year-old patient, um, who had an abortion procedure, um, and experiencing hemorrhage."

Then on September 24, an ambulance picked up a 28-year-old woman around noon from the St. Paul Planned Parenthood (PP) to transport to M Health Fairview West Bank (formerly Fairview-Riverside) for a "traumatic injury . . . possible perforated uterus from a procedure," according to 911 records.

We pray for these women and mourn the deaths of their children. Also, less than a week prior, on September 18, another ambulance was filmed outside that PP in St. Paul. No details are available about that situation.

Finally, a sidewalk counselor saw a woman collapse outside the Mankato PP on a Wednesday (abortion day) early in October. Two PP employees and a male companion helped her get up and into the car. The sidewalk counselor said that they didn't take her back into PP for observation or to check her vitals.

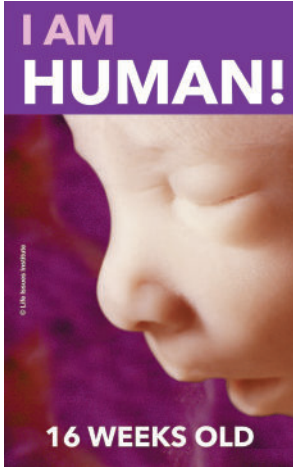
