PP Preparing to Kill Babies in St. Cloud, Minn.

Since Planned Parenthood (PP) opened an abortion-referral and birth control facility in St. Cloud about 30 years ago, pro-lifers from that city and the surrounding area have consistently prayed and picketed there. They have also held 40 Days for Life campaigns there twice a year since 2007. Now they have even more reason to oppose this evil organization in their area.

Planned Parenthood North Central States (PPNCS) recently posted an opening on its job site, advertising for an "Ultrasound Technician (Abortion Services)" for the St. Cloud location. It appears that PP is setting up another site in which to do chemical abortions (the abortion pill) via webcam, as they do in Uptown Minneapolis, Brooklyn Park, Rochester and Mankato. (The woman goes to the facility for an ultrasound, speaks with the abortionist via webcam, then takes the first drug of the abortion pill regimen on-site, and the second drug at home. The St. Paul PP does both chemical AND surgical abortions.)

The advertised job opening is for 8

hours per week, "primarily Tuesdays," with "start date flexibility." As this newsletter goes to press, we do not know when PP will start killing babies there, but Brian Gibson, CEO of Pro-Life Action Ministries, was one of the speakers at the St. Cloud 40 Days for Life closing event on March 28, offering our sidewalk counseling training, and leaving literature and sidewalk counseling signs with the St. Cloud pro-lifers so that they are well-prepared to start reaching out to abortion clients with pro-life alternatives.

"Since PP came to town, there has ALWAYS been some 'presence of PRAYING' going on in front of their building for some hours on Tuesdays and Fridays," said Judy Haag, leader of the local 40 Days for Life group. "The Knights of Columbus were very involved in keeping this praying happening. They were very dedicated." She added that when she and Mary Jo Ruhland were planning to conduct 40 Days for Life there, they met with the Office of Marriage & Family at the St. Cloud Diocesan Office where Chris Cadden was the leader. Judi said diocesan approval and assistance helped greatly and has continued to this day.

"Mary Jo no longer leads with me (health reasons)," Judy continued, "but we have a system of 'Captains of the Day' which works very well to keep us with at least two people out there praying from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday through Friday (during 40 Days for Life). People come from all corners of the St. Cloud Diocese, and some from the New Ulm Diocese also take scheduled hours. VERY DEDICATED people, very prayerful people. We are currently all VERY UPSET about this plan of PP to start doing abortions at this facility. We very much appreciate the assistance we are getting from Brian Gibson."

From the CEO, Brian Gibson . . .

Whistles, Billboards and Babies

At the opening prayer for our Lenten 40 Days for Life campaign, a man with a camera and a red whistle around his neck showed up. He stationed himself across the street from our gathering in front of the mega-Planned Parenthood in St. Paul. Without any interaction with any of us, he stood there, apparently filming us the whole time.

A day later we were featured in a social media post. That man took a still photo from before the event began when only a few of us were setting up for the prayer time. In the post he made two serious accusations against us (or so they seem to have been to his thinking and those who may follow his posts): none of us were wearing whistles and we were only there to make sure babies would be around to cover our costs in our old age.

The comment about a lack of whistles is a reference to the belief that anyone who stands publicly against the killing of the unborn aren't ever ready to protest against ICE. Never mind the varying degrees of concern or acceptance of ICE activities that may be felt by those pro-lifers gathered. In this thinking, we were concerned for the non-humans over concern for those already alive. The second accusation was just a ridiculous assumption.

Fast forward several weeks. One of our "I Am Human" billboards atop a building at the corner of Lyndale and Franklin Avenues in Minneapolis was vandalized. On the tagline "Why is it Okay to Abort Me?" the word "abort" had red paint through it and underneath, in that same red, the word "deport" was painted. Back in the office, we talked of this as a back-handed way of acknowledging the humanity of the unborn. But then an email came. Referencing the same language as on the vandalized billboard ("Why is it okay to abort me? Or much better...Why is it okay to DEPORT me?"), we were told, "Take care of the kids that are already alive and on this planet" and that we would "burn in hell." It was laced with profanities and possibly written by the prime suspect in the billboard vandalism. No, this wasn't a back-

handed acknowledgment. It was a direct assault on the humanity of the unborn.

This thought among pro-abortion people, that the unborn somehow don't exist or are not human until they are born, denies all reality and, or course, science. This is the crux of the issue we are faced with in this post-*Dobbs* world, the intentional blindness to the truth.

Yet there is the unintentional blindness to the truth about the humanity of the unborn that is far more prevalent



and far more dangerous. Too many of our fellow Christians do not regard the unborn as fully human. Not that most are not pro-life. It's just the out-of-sight, out-of-mind syndrome that is so easy to fall into for all of us. And don't we just get tired of hearing about this "issue" so often? Can't we just move on?

Our work is cut out for us. We all must boldly and loudly proclaim the babies and who they are to all the world. Yes, we must care for the moms and the dads. We even must care for those who oppose us. But the true reality is that these babies are real living human beings, being led to certain death, and we must be their voices before the world. They are our neighbors, the least of Jesus' brothers and sisters, those we are commanded to love.

Recent Ministry Events in Duluth and Moorhead

DULUTH (first and second photos) —

Pro-Life Ministries of Duluth, led by Pastor Tom Schaer, conducted a witness in front of the Depot on March 5 to protest a big fundraiser by the WE Health abortion facility in that city. They held signs, read Scripture and prayed. Two of the abortion mill’s escorts were sent out to warn the attendees not to listen to the pro-lifers. Pastor Tom prayed that a hole would swallow up their resources and the pro-lifers learned that the fundraiser raised only half of what the abortion supporters wanted.

On March 28, 55 people come to the Jericho March outside the Building for Women (which houses the WE Health abortion facility). “It was a great blessing and fun,” said Sarah Winandy, Assistant Director of Pro-Life Ministries of Duluth. Mike Hogan blew his shofar with every one of the seven rounds they marched around the building. At each stop in front of the abortion center they read Scripture, prayed and sang.

MOORHEAD (third photo) —

A warm 50 degrees greeted about 30 people for the first Lenten 40 Days for Life closing celebration March 29 outside the Red River Women’s abortion facility in Moorhead. Bishop Andrew Cozzens of the Diocese of Crookston (which includes Moorhead) was the featured speaker. He told the powerful personal story of how his mother, when pregnant with him, was told by a doctor after her water broke at 20 weeks that her baby was severely deformed, a “freak,” and recommended an early induced delivery, which would have been an abortion. Bishop Cozzens’ mother told that doctor that her baby was a gift from God and she didn’t care if he had deformities. She requested a different doctor. This doctor, a specialist, put her on bedrest and Bishop Cozzens was born about a month early, with some allergies, but otherwise healthy! The story of his birth has caused him to always appreciate the significance of the pro-life movement. “Life is always God’s choice,” Bishop Cozzens said, “and always God’s solution.”

The crowd celebrated a confirmed baby saved on the first day of this 40 Days campaign (and prayed for the mom as she requested), and a possible baby saved at the end of the campaign (and prayed that the father continues to protect his child). They enjoyed music by Tim Mosser, director of the Diocese of Fargo Respect Life office, and his son Romeo, 8, (on the drums).



On the Front Lines

(Editor's note — These two stories by Michele Herzog, Manager of our Central Florida Branch, show, in various ways, the profound significance of our presence on the front lines of the abortion battle.)

1) Many months ago, a young abortion-bound couple arrived at the AWHC abortuary and were greeted by Christians loving their neighbors as themselves. They were offered help, hope, the truth of what abortion truly is, and the beautiful gospel of Christ. They listened, and reversed their original decision of abortion to choosing life for their baby created in the image of God.

They could only speak Spanish, so John, one of the great sidewalk counselors here, who speaks Spanish fluently, kept in touch with them continually throughout the pregnancy, checking to see if they needed anything, and telling them that we were all praying for them. We had planned on having a big baby shower for them!

Unfortunately, at 29 weeks, mom went into labor and was rushed to Winnie Palmer Hospital, where she gave birth to their little son.

Dale and Marian, who also are incredible sidewalk counselors (and Dale preaches as well outside AWHC on Saturday mornings) went to see the couple at the hospital. They speak Spanish fluently also, thank the Lord.

Dale and Marian's love for this couple overflowed, and they stayed with them all day, helping with paperwork, trying to find local housing and praying with them. They went back the next day, and this is when the couple was informed that their child was not going to make it. How wonderful Dale and Marian were there to comfort them in their time of sorrow.

The baby did pass a few days after birth, and on Good Friday, the funeral for this precious child was held. We were all invited to be there, with Dale being asked to do the preaching—what an honor and such a tremendous blessing for this couple to allow us to be there to mourn their child with them.

This was the first time I've ever gone to the funeral of a little one saved from abortion in all the years I've been minis-

tering at the abortion mills. It was truly emotional knowing that this couple turned from their plans in the beginning, and truly loved their child for the time they had him.

Dale did indeed preach the gospel of Christ, the only true hope, and the Lord God Almighty was high and lifted up with much compassion at this solemn funeral service. We ended with "Amazing Grace," which was so very beautiful, and prayer with many tears.

I'm so thankful that the parents of this little one were able to love, hold and weep for their baby before he passed away, and even after at the funeral service. This little baby boy was small, but so perfect in every way, and this made my resolve even stronger to fight for the lives of these children who have no voice but ours.

Certainly this Good Friday was different than any I have ever experienced, but how beautiful to bring the Good News to the brokenhearted. And how wonderful the whole family went to Dale and Marian's church on Resurrection Sunday! Praise the Lord!

Thank you John for being there the day this couple came so many months ago to the abortuary, thank you Marian and Dale for all the love you have extended. Thank you Lord for allowing us to be a comfort to this family while they've been going through their time of mourning, in Jesus name. Praise the Lord!

2) Last summer, an abortion-bound mom came to the AWHC abortion mill for a scheduled abortion appointment—until we had the opportunity to speak with her, offering hope, the help available and the truth about abortion. She quickly chose life for her baby with such a grateful heart that we were there to help her!

We made plans to get together for lunch, but unfortunately, she never returned any of our phone calls, or text messages. We began to think she changed her mind and possibly went through with the abortion. But—we kept praying for her and the baby!

Out of nowhere, a few weeks ago she reached out via text message with a picture of her beautiful baby girl, the baby that was saved last summer!



Oh the joy we have all felt, seeing this precious gift from God that we prayed was still alive and we thank the Lord that this mom stayed true to her word, truly choosing life for her child!

This is just another example of the importance of being in front of these abortion centers—these places of death—as a last-ditch effort to save the children being led to the slaughter! Being that voice for the babies, and offering help to their mamas!

And never give up praying! Thank you Jesus!

She asked specifically for a yellow car as a sign, and she saw a yellow car! She took literature and a fetal model from the sidewalk counselors as she left.

Grandmother Kicked Out of Abortion Mill; Baby Saved!

(Editor's note — the following is condensed from a report written by Sarah Winandy, Assistant Director of Pro-Life Ministries of Duluth, and published in their March newsletter.)

The last week of January a mom came out of the WE Health abortion mill and confirmed that she had changed her mind. This brought such joy to our hearts that we couldn't stop smiling for the rest of the day.

It started earlier that morning when "Kay" dropped her daughter "Val" (names changed) off in front of the abortion center. I was able to reach my hand over the outstretched arms of the abortion escorts and give our literature to Val, and I said, "Look at your ultrasound and listen to the heartbeat of your baby." She said, "I will."

Later I learned from Kay that she had tried to talk Val out of the abortion while she drove her there. She added, "I went into the waiting room and was crying. As I sat on the couch, they told me I had to leave because I was crying. I said I wanted to be there for my daughter. They told me, 'That is our couch and get out of here.'"

We saw Kay come out of the building very angry, cursing each one of the escorts. I asked if I could help her and she thought I was with them and cursed me too. Soon Val came out and very

quickly got into Kay's car. I asked if they had changed their minds and both of them, with tears streaming down their faces, said, "yes." I told them we would love to help them in any way, whether they needed financial help or any support.

When our newest and young sidewalk counselor Shawna came over to speak with them, Val quickly connected with her. She said she was 11 weeks pregnant. We gave them our contact information and encouraged them to call us, which Kay did a few days later!

She told us that while Val was being given an ultrasound at the abortion center, she asked to see it. She saw her baby moving and jumping around and immediately changed her mind about having the abortion! Kay seems very friendly, and in our first phone conversation, said, "You are all doing a good work there. Thank you for what you do. You saved our baby." All glory be to God!

More Abortions, More Tax-Money at PP

(The following figures are from BEFORE Planned Parenthood was defunded for one year, which began on July 4, 2025.)

From Planned Parenthood Federation of America's (PPFA) recently-released 2024-2025 Annual Report:

For service year ending Sept. 30, 2024:

* PPFA committed 434,450 abortions (the most ever in one year and an 8% increase from the previous year). Overall, PP has killed about 9.5 million children in abortions.

* Very few PP facilities do prenatal care, with abortions outnumbering prenatal care services nearly 57 to 1. Only 7,685 prenatal care services were provided at PP and just 3,038 women were referred for adoptions.

* Cancer screenings (including Pap tests, but not mammograms) continued to decline.

PPFA's Annual Report (from page 5)

* PPFA is also in the business of transgender “hormone therapy,” being one of the largest providers in the country. Not listed separately in the report, the number of “other services” under which “transgender services” is included, was 50,411.

For fiscal year ending June 30, 2025:

* PPFA took in more than \$2.1 billion in revenue, receiving \$832 million from taxpayers in government grants, contracts, and Medicaid reimbursements (up \$39.8 million from the previous year). This is close to 40% of its total revenue.

PPFA has a long history of being the major player in filing lawsuits against pro-life laws. In its most recent annual report, PPFA touted its litigation against pro-life laws in 15 states. PPFA is also challenging pro-life federal policies in two cases. In two-thirds of these cases, the pro-life laws have been blocked or hindered, resulting in children being killed by abortion who otherwise might have been saved.

Cost of Abortion Highest in Minn.

According to Operation Rescue's *2025 Annual Report* (www.operationrescue.org), the average cost of an abortion in Minnesota is \$1014, the only state where the average cost is more than \$1000. According to Minnesota Citizens Concerned for Life (MCCL), Medicaid/Medical Assistance reimbursement rates are capped per state rules, but state reimbursement rates for abortions were increased twice in the last three years—by 20% in 2023 and another 20% in 2024, while few or no other medical procedures had their reimbursement rates increased. Yet, Our Justice, an abortion fund based in Minnesota, is currently lobbying the Minnesota Legislature for tens of millions MORE of your tax money to put into the pockets of abortionists for killing children.

Pray for . . . Cori Baill

Please join us in praying for abortionist Cori Baill, who commits abortions for Planned Parenthood of Southwest and Central Florida, along with the All Women's Health Center abortion chain (of course we know they are not health centers by any stretch of the imagination)!

She has been affiliated with Planned Parenthood, serving on the National Medical Committee, and as a regional and local Medical Director, along with being an advisor, laboratory director, and Florida State House physician liaison for Planned Parenthood of Southwest and Central Florida.

Baill is a very vocal advocate, supporter, and promoter for abortion rights (the right to kill innocent babies), and has authored opinion pieces supporting access to abortions/the abortion industry. She once tried to run me over when she was leaving after killing babies.

Join us in crying out to the Lord that Baill will repent of the shedding of innocent blood, which she has been doing for over 30 years. Pray that she would fall to her knees and surrender her heart to Christ, and never harm another child. The blood of the children that she has killed cry out for justice!

Is Your Doctor Involved in Abortions?

Does Your Doctor Prescribe Abortifacient Birth Control?

Ask your doctor if he/she does abortions (especially with the current increase and “ease” of prescribing the abortion pill) or refers for them, or prescribes abortifacients such as the Pill, Ortho Evra (the “patch”), Depo-Provera (the “shot”), Nuva-Ring, the “morning-after pill,” implants, or the IUD. All these methods (and others) can cause very early abortions by thinning the lining of the uterus so that if breakthrough ovulation occurs (which is possible) and a new life is conceived, the young human being may not be able to attach to the uterine lining and therefore he or she dies. News Briefs

* The last remaining criminal charge was dropped against David Daleiden and Sandra Merritt, the undercover reporters who exposed the illegal sale of aborted baby body parts by PP and other abortionists, including Whole Woman's in the Twin Cities. This follows 10 years of legal warfare by the abortion industry. The settlement included no jail time, no fines, no probation and no admission of wrongdoing. The prosecution had begun under then-California Attorney General Kamala Harris. Also, the Trump administration has stopped federal funding of research which obtains and uses the body parts of aborted babies.

* Mark Houck, the pro-life prayer supporter who pushed away an abortion escort who was verbally assaulting his 12-year-old son, recently won a \$1.1 million dollar settlement from the U.S. Department of Justice. Under the Biden administration, the DOJ had arrested Houck at gunpoint at home in front of his wife and young children, charging him under FACE and another federal law, and threatening 11 years in prison. Mark was acquitted of those charges and then sued the DOJ.

* The DOJ released "The Biden Administration's Weaponization of the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act", an 882-page report that confirmed what pro-lifers suspected about the previous DOJ targeting peaceful pro-lifers and downplaying vandalism by abortion supporters against pregnancy resource centers. The DOJ recently fired at least 4 prosecutors who were involved in the FACE cases against pro-lifers and who were still at the DOJ.

* A new law under Puerto Rico's Civil Code affirms that an unborn baby is a "natural person" from conception for civil purposes, such as inheritance. "While the law does not alter Puerto Rico's current abortion statutes, it establishes an important legal and moral precedent by embedding recognition of the unborn child within the territory's legal framework," said the National Right to Life Committee. "This historic legal recognition marks one of the strongest pro-life affirmations within U.S. jurisdictions."

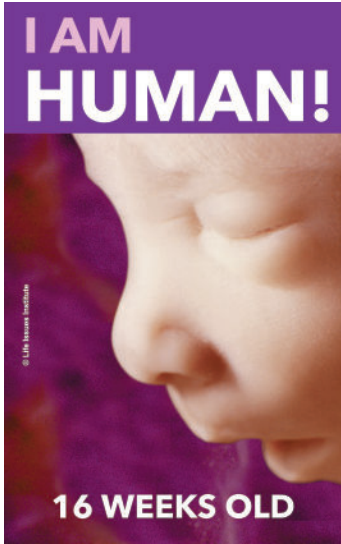
